The main parking lot is generally reserved for staff but parents can usually find parking along the streets surrounding Millgrove. There are a few designated visitor and handicapped parking spots (in front of the school). Please follow the directions of the supervisors; drop off is quick to let the children out and move on so others can also do the same.
