## June 2021 - TRUSTEE Report for School Council

This is a living document that sets out wh at success in education in Parkland School Division. The following report uses the Board Assurance Elements as a guideline:

**Engage, Listen and Promote Advocacy:** The board met with Council members from Paul First Nation earlier this month. We make best efforts to meet with our municipal partners once a year. We also met with Spruce Grove, Stony Plain and Parkland County previously. We have had a number of meetings with our three MLAs this past year. Building relationships and keeping the lines of communication open is necessary and important.

**Foster Quality Learning and Wellness:** Administration presented the Instructional Services Report to the Board today.

## **Fiscal Responsibility:**

<u>Trustee Remuneration</u>: Board moved to maintain the current remuneration structure permanently. This is a new structure that provides a base remuneration amount and eliminates the previous remuneration of base + per diem. Trustees also reduced the overall professional development budget and reorganized the allocation to include a pooled amount and an individual amount.

The Joint Use committee includes members from PSD, the City and Evergreen Catholic School Division to discuss and find solutions to best meet the needs of our community.
