## MILLGROVE TRACK MORNING - JUNE 79:30-1:00 PM!

Millgrove's grade $\mathbf{1 - 4}$ students will be participating in a mock track meet/cooperative games day. This half-day is designed to get our students outside and to have them be active as well as interact with students in different classes and at different grade levels. In addition, this will also allow us an opportunity to get some ideas for running a track meet next year at Millgrove for our K-4 students.

The front playground will be a communal break area for students to set up camp which might include a blanket or a lawn chair. It will also be where they can eat their snack and lunch, This will be the only eating area. No food will be allowed outside of this area. Students are expected to bring their own lunches. Snacks from the parent council are not meant to replace their healthy lunches.

Snacks will be provided when students complete certain events. This will be run by the parent council. Each teacher will be provided with a set of 3 tickets for each student. One for a drink, one for a bag of chips and one for a freezie. These will be given out to the students at varying times during the day.

Teachers will be setting up a station each which will be run by one to grade 9 students travelling over to help us make this day awesome for everyone. Each class will travel around with their teachers and support staff to stations, rotating every 15 mins .

Parents are welcome to come out and watch the festivities!



We kick off the day with a Pet Parade from 9:15-10:00 am in the field south of the school. Please take care in following a few simple rules of participation:

- pets and adult pet owners can assemble in the south field along the fence between 8:45-9:05 am
- students go to class as they normally would and join parents and pets after attendance
- NO PETS are allowed in the school
- have pets on a leash, harness, in a cage or in a bowl, especially if they have trouble making friends
- bring your own pooper scooper supplies as the Millgrove carnival will be held in the same area
- all pets must return home after the pet parade at 10:00 am while students return to their classrooms to prepare for the carnival activities

The carnival activities will take place between 10:15 am - 12:30 pm Students will earn points as they participate in carnival activities. Once they earn enough points, they can be redeemed for 1 freezie and 1 bag of popcorn.

## Numeracy Tips



Numeracy is really easy to fit into your child's day and does not take long or require fancy materials. Below are some numeracy tips you can use at home!

- Water Balloon Math! This is great for students of all ages. You will need some water balloons, a sharpie and chalk. Start by writing "Target Numbers" with the chalk. Depending on what your child is working on (addition, subtraction, multiplication or division) write target numbers that will correspond to equations written on the water balloons with the sharpie. For example; you could write 7, 9, and 12 as the "Target Numbers" and then the water balloons would have corresponding equations that equal those numbers like; $5+2,6+1$, $3+6,9-2,4 \times 3,3 \times 3,36 / 3$, etc. Your child will try to hit those target numbers with the matching equation. Lots of fun to be had here.
- Count and compare with watermelon seeds. Your child can place their watermelon seeds on a plate and count them. If you eat a lot of watermelon make a chart to compare seed counts. You can ask questions like; how many seeds were there on Monday? Which watermelon had the most seeds? How many seeds in total did we find during the week?
- Take a Math Hike! For older students, have them look for different geometric shapes. Estimate the angles of tree branches or leaves and then check with a protractor. For younger students, measure and chart elements like daily temperature highs and lows, the growth of a certain plant on a trail or the amount of rainfall.
- At a restaurant? After you order, hang onto the menus and try these games while you wait for your food to arrive. Ask your kids to find the most and least expensive items. Challenge them to count up the total number of dishes between $\$ 8$ and $\$ 12$. Tell them you have \$47.23 to spend on the meal and ask how that can be divided equally between each family member. Issue a challenge to find the weirdest combination of menu items that totals $\$ 36$.
- Math on the Beach! Write the numbers 1 to 11 on a beach ball or another large ball. When a player catches the ball they either add, multiply, divide or subtract (depending on what skill you want to practice) the two numbers that their hands are touching.

We hope these games give you some fun and different ideas to help your child with their numeracy skills during the summer!
