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

As I have been getting to know the children and classes during September I am working with teachers to find the best ways to increase Numeracy skills. We will be doing some pull out groups and I will be working within some classrooms.

Numeracy Tips For Home

Play board games and card games. Actual board games where children are moving game pieces and counting as they move the pieces is important. The physical movement as they count is important. Children may start seeing patterns and add on by twos, threes, or more along with counting by ones. Snakes and Ladders, Checkers, Sorry, or many other games will help children with many Math skills.

Card games such as Fish to get children started with identifying numbers and matching the number symbol to the number of shapes on the cards. War, Crazy Eights, Uno, Memory, Crib and many more. All games make it fun and can help build a variety of Math skills. A weekly game night where your child helps choose the games to play helps your child look forward to those nights.

Literacy Tips

Parent teacher interviews are just around the corner and your child's teacher may mention Phonological Awareness. Our staff has participated in many researched based in-services last year on this topic and Mrs. Madge-Arkinstall has purchased several resources to assist teachers in developing Phonological Awareness in our students. The umbrella shows the components of Phonological Awareness.

REMEMBER THE FOCUS IS ON THE SOUNDS, NOT SPELLING PATTERNS. Phonological awareness is oral, phonics is visual. What is Phonological awareness? It is the ability to recognize and manipulate the spoken parts of sentences and words. Why is it so important? A student's level of phonological awareness at the end of kindergarten is one of the strongest predictors of future reading success in grade one and beyond. (Adams et al. 2008)


The Phonological awareness umbrella has a section called 'Phonemic Awareness', you can see, 'Phonemic Awareness' has many components to it. Here are some terms you will want to be familiar with:

Phoneme: the smallest unit of sound represented by a letter or letters.

Grapheme: the letter or letters that represent a phoneme.

Phonemic awareness: the ability to identify, hear and manipulate the smallest sounds heard in spoken language, (phonemes.)
