## **Numeracy Tips**

One of the activities we do at school to increase Numeracy skills is count collections of objects. Counting and organizing the objects children count helps with one to one matching when counting, saying numbers in order, identifying how many objects are in a group, place value, addition, subtraction, fractions, multiplication and division. Objects in your home that your child can count could be toys, hockey cards, Pokemon cards, Lego, rocks, craft supplies, etc.

When your child is counting encourage them to count and move the objects as they say the numbers, put the objects in organized groups to improve accuracy, ask how many they have, how many groups they have, how many are in each group, tell how many they have by skip counting (by twos, fives, tens, etc.) and touching or moving the correct amount as they count. To extend the counting further ask how they could record (write) the way they counted. Can they show it another way? How many more would you need to get to a specific number (e.g. I have 87, how many more do I need to get to 100?).

### **Literacy Tips**

Parkland School Division has a focus on writing this year. As a school, we will be writing an HLAT (Highest Level of Achievement Test) in the next two weeks. Students are provided with a prompt they need to use to create a narrative writing piece. At the end of February, we will be writing another one with the prompt provided by Parkland School Division. All schools in the division will be using this prompt for their writing. Teachers will all have exemplars to assist them with their marking. If your child has accommodations for writing in their class, these accommodations will be used during the writing of the HLAT.
