Literacy Tips

As children develop as readers, they build fluency: the ability to read with accuracy, a justright pace, and appropriate expression. In order to understand what they read, children must be able to read fluently both aloud and silently. When reading aloud, fluent readers group words into phrases and add intonation. Their reading is smooth and has expression.

Children who do not read with fluency sound choppy and awkward, and this can also make reading laborious and unappealing for the reader. Below we have outlined some strategies to help build a child's fluency:

- Have your child track words while you read a passage out loud. Afterward, have them read the passage matching your voice.
- Have your child practice reading the same list of words, phrase, or short passages several times.
- Remind your child to pause between sentences and phrases.
- Read aloud to your child with phrasing and expression to provide an example of how fluent reading sounds.
- Give your child books with predictable vocabulary and clear rhythmic patterns so the child can "hear" the sound of fluent reading as they read the book aloud.
- Use audiobooks; have your child follow along in the print copy.
- Support and encourage your child. Realize that they are likely frustrated by reading, and they will continue to grow with practice.

Did you know that in Canada we no longer use commas to separate groups of numbers? So we write 14 257 with a space between the numbers instead of a comma.

Did you know that we do not use the word "and" when we say numbers in the hundreds? When we say "and" it means we have a fraction (decimal). So when we want to say 492 we should say "four hundred ninety two" rather than "four hundred and ninety two."

Gift Ideas:








Coding Club
