

The registration deadline has now passed. Enrolment impacts budgets and staffing, and therefore, we need to ensure we are up-to-date with school registrations as soon as possible.

How do I get started?

Visit https://powerschool.psd.ca/public/ and log into your parent account. Once inside the Parent Portal:

- Select your child's name in the blue bar at the top of the screen.
- Select the RSVP icon on the left side of the screen.
- Begin reviewing all of your current Student Information we have on file, and follow the instructions on the screen to navigate through the various tabs in the form (Student Info, Address, Contacts, Medical, etc.).






Snow Maze Happiness!

Literacy Tips Nonfiction Writing

In our Millgrove writing programs, we are excited to dive into the world of nonfiction text structures with our students! Some of our writing at school is narrative, such as imaginative stories or personal stories from students' lives, but we also spend time writing (and reading) nonfiction text structures. Understanding different genres and text structures not only enhances reading comprehension but also lays the groundwork for proficient writing skills. Nonfiction text structures include:

- Description: sharing knowledge and facts about a particular topic
 - For example a descriptive report on fruit bats
- Instruction: teaching your readers how to achieve a defined goal or how to follow a set of directions
 - For example instructions on how to build a snowman
- Persuasion: convincing your reader of a certain position and explaining a point of view
 For example a letter to the teacher about why the class should get a pet fish
- Comparison: describing the similarities and differences between two or more topics
 For example a piece comparing Canada and Ukraine
- Biography: telling the sequential story of a real person's life and their achievements
 For example a biography of Connor McDavid
- Explanation: explaining why or how something happens
 - For example a report on how glaciers form over time

As your child engages with these various text structures, we encourage you to foster their curiosity by exploring nonfiction texts together at home. Whether it's identifying the sequential order in a recipe or discussing the comparison and contrast in a nature documentary, every opportunity to engage with nonfiction enriches literacy skills. Exploring these text structures nurtures our young writers to become confident communicators and critical thinkers.


