

If you have supplies at home and do not require the entire package, the system will allow you to reduce the items to suit your needs. If you need everything, submit the recommended list as is.

Please submit online orders by Saturday, June 1, 2024, for them to be delivered to the school. Delivery will be made to the school the 3rd week of June and must be picked up before the end of the school year. Write-On will still accept any and all orders over the summer however, delivery will be to your home for a fee of \$10.


PARKLAND SCHOOL DIVISION TRY-ME 2024 TRY-ATHLON

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Literacy Tips

Reading at Home with Your Child: Navigating Ebooks

In today's digital age, electronic children's books, or ebooks, are one way to engage readers (especially children who might be more reluctant to read). These digital alternatives to traditional print books offer a variety of experiences, from basic digital versions to more interactive and immersive options.

First-generation e-readers like Kindle and Nook provide a simple transition from print to digital reading. Children can scroll through pages, mirroring the experience of flipping through a physical book. However, newer devices such as iPads and the Nook Color elevate the ebook experience with vibrant colors and touchscreen capabilities. At Millgrove students often access apps like Raz-Kids and Epic (the latter of which requires a paid subscription outside of school hours). These "enhanced" ebooks offer an array of features, including read-aloud options, interactive games, and even music that complements the story.

While interactive ebooks can be engaging, questions linger about their impact on crucial early literacy skills. Do they effectively foster letter recognition and comprehension? The research in this area is still emerging, but observations of families engaging with ebooks offer valuable insights.

To ensure that ebook reading remains focused on the story and supports literacy development, we offer the following tips:

- Acknowledge the Novelty: Allow your child time to explore the features of a new ebook.
 Once the initial excitement wears off, encourage them to engage with the story without too many distractions.
- 2.Balance Fun and Focus: While enjoying the interactive features, help your child strike a balance between entertainment and comprehension. Encourage discussions about the story and ask questions to deepen their understanding.
- 3.Stay Engaged: Resist the temptation to let the device take over, and continue to be present as your child reads. Families can actively participate in the reading experience by having meaningful conversations, highlighting interesting words, and sharing your enthusiasm for literacy.

By keeping these tips in mind, you can ensure that ebook reading becomes an enriching and enjoyable experience for both you and your child.
