


MEMORY BOOK COVER CONTEST WINNERS!


Congratulations to Sam Phillips, who won first place in our cover contest! Her artwork will be featured on the front cover of our Millgrove memory book.








Any outstanding fee statements have been emailed to parents and guardians in May. Please pay fees online through the Parent Portal.


The division does have a waiver process outlined on their website, and payment options are available through the Parent Portal. Please visit PSD's REGISTRATION FEES page for more information.

Pet Parade

We kick off the day with a Pet Parade from **9:15-10:00 am** in the field south of the school. Please take care in following a few simple rules of participation.

- pets and adult pet owners can assemble in the south field along the fence between 8:45-9:05 am
- students go to class as they normally would and join parents and pets after class attendance and O Canada
- if students do not have pets for this day, that's ok they will stay with their classroom teacher to watch the parade
- NO PETS are allowed in the school
- pets must be on a leash, harness, in a cage or in a bowl
- bring your own pooper scooper supplies, as the Millgrove carnival will be held in the same area afterwards
- all pets must return home after the pet parade at 10:00 am while students return to their classrooms to prepare for the carnival activities

Carnival

The carnival activities will take place between 10:30 am - 12:32 pm Students will earn points as they participate in carnival activities. Once they earn enough points, they can be redeemed for 1 freezie and 1 bag of popcorn.

Lunch

Through our President's Choice Children's Charity nutrition grant, our Millgrove Foundation will organize a Subway lunch for all students. Lunch order forms have gone home to families through your classroom teacher. Literacy Tips

Summer Reading Success

The summer is a perfect time for your child to take a break and enjoy lots of free play! One thing to be mindful of with that break is that studies show that children who don't read or have access to books during the summer can lose up to two months of reading progress. So, how can we prevent the summer slide—or even boost reading growth? Here are some suggestions:

Visit the Spruce Grove Public Library! The Spruce Grove Public Library has a wonderful Kids Summer Reading Program that you can register for <u>using this link</u> or the QR code below. You can submit your child's reading log online or in person, and prizes will be randomly drawn each week during the summer!

Read Just Right Books. Help your child find books that are just right for them. These "right fit" books should be interesting to your child and at an appropriate reading level. Use the five-finger test to check if a book is too difficult: open to a page with lots of words, and have your child read. Hold up a finger for each word they don't know. If you have four or five fingers up, the book might be too challenging for them to read independently. But feel free to read one like that together!

Read Daily for at Least 20 Minutes. Research shows that a child who reads just one minute a day outside of school will learn 8,000 words by the end of sixth grade, while a child who reads for 20 minutes a day will learn 1.8 million words! That's a big difference. If reading isn't a top priority for your child, consider setting up a reward system.

Read for Different Purposes. Incorporate reading into everyday activities, like following a recipe or assembling a toy.

Play Word Games and Use Technology. Games like Apples to Apples can improve vocabulary. Turn games like hopscotch or four square into learning opportunities by including letters or sight words. Check out the "8 Super Summer Sight Word Activities" on the Make, Take & Teach blog. If you have an iPad, explore interactive books and apps that focus on phonics and early reading skills. Many websites also offer free reading-related games.
