Arrival Procedures and Visitors



We love to see your faces bright and early but our **supervision does not start until 8:40 am**. Please see the <u>Student Handbook</u> for information about our school.

Literacy

Welcome back to school! It's going to be a great year of learning and fun. Reading at home is an important part of your child's overall success. You can help your child develop good reading skills.

SIMPLE STRATEGIES FOR CREATING STRONG READERS

Without doubt, reading with children spells success for early literacy. Putting a few simple strategies into action will make a significant difference in helping children develop into good readers and writers. Through reading aloud, providing print materials, and promoting positive attitudes about reading and writing, you can have a powerful impact on children's literacy and learning.

• Invite a child to read with you every day.

• When reading a book where the print is large, point word by word as you read. This will help the child learn that reading goes from left to right and understand that the word he or she says is the word he or she sees.

- Read a child's favorite book over and over again.
- Read many stories with rhyming words and lines that repeat. Invite the child to join in on these parts. Point, word by word, as he or she reads along with you.
- Discuss new words. For example, "This big house is called a palace. Who do you think lives in a palace?"
- Stop and ask about the pictures and about what is happening in the story.
- Read from a variety of children's books, including fairy tales, song books, poems, and information books. Reading well is at the heart of all learning. Children who can't read well, can't learn. Help make a difference for a child.

Numeracy

Math Focus in Our Classrooms: Building Strong Number Sense

In our math classes, we're focused on helping students develop a deeper understanding of place value, which goes beyond simply knowing which digit is in the tens or hundreds place. At Millgrove School, one of our goals is to support students in becoming flexible thinkers who can see numbers in different ways.

The Importance of 10

For younger students, we emphasize understanding the importance of the number 10. Do they know the different combinations that add up to 10? A great way to practice this at home is by playing a modified version of Go Fish. Instead of matching pairs, players ask for the number needed to make 10. For example, if your child has a 6, they would ask, "Do you have a 4?" This game helps strengthen their understanding of number combinations, building a strong math foundation.

Thinking in Larger Numbers

As students progress into higher grades, we encourage them to think more flexibly about numbers. Can your child recognize that in the number 324, there are actually 32 tens, even though the 2 is in the tens place? Or that in 700, there are 70 tens and 7 hundreds? This kind of flexible thinking helps students build confidence and a deeper understanding of place value with larger numbers.

Grade 3 and 4: The Big Bean Count

Recently, our Grade 3 and 4 students participated in the Big Bean Count! Over the past two weeks, they've been working together to count in tens, hundreds, and even thousands using beans, cups, and plates. They discovered that in 700, there are 700 individual beans (ones), 70 cups (tens), and 7 plates (hundreds). This hands-on activity taught students that by breaking down big tasks into smaller, manageable steps, they can accomplish great things. It also highlighted the power of teamwork — when we work together, we can achieve big goals, one step (or bean) at a time!

We encourage you to try similar activities at home to help your child explore numbers in creative and exciting ways!
