Literacy

Fluency

Fluency is the ability to read with accuracy, good speed, and appropriate expression. In order to understand what they read, children must be able to read fluently whether they are reading aloud or silently. Their reading is smooth and has expression.

Here are some clues that your child may have problems with fluency:

- They know how to read words but it seems to take a long time to read a short book or passage silently.
- They read a book with no expression.
- They stumble a lot and lose their place when reading something aloud.
- · They read aloud very slowly.
- They move their mouth when reading silently (subvocalizing).

What parents can do to help at home:

- Support and encourage your child. Realize that he or she is likely frustrated by reading.
- If your child can decode words well, help him or her build speed and accuracy by:
 - Reading aloud and having your child match his voice to yours
 - Having your child practice reading the same list of words, phrase, or short passages several times
 - Reminding your child to pause between sentences and phrases
 - Read aloud to your child to provide an example of how fluent reading sounds.
 - Give your child books with predictable vocabulary and clear rhythmic patterns so the child can "hear" the sound of fluent reading as he or she reads the book aloud.
 - Use books on tapes; have the child follow along in the print copy.

The key to great reading is practice. Thank you for helping your child by practicing reading at home.

Numeracy

Math Focus in Our Classrooms: Counting

You might hear your child talking about "counting collections" at school. This activity is essential in helping students practice counting and recognizing patterns in our number system. It may seem simple—give a child a number of items to count—but it supports many important math skills. Students often use whiteboards for counting collections so they can connect the concrete (physical items) with the abstract (written numbers). This helps them not just count but also understand how numbers relate to each other.

Why Counting Matters:

Counting is a fundamental skill, but it doesn't always come naturally. Children need lots of practice, and you can support this at home by counting everyday objects like toys, snacks, or even socks. The goal is to help them notice the patterns in counting—like twenty-one, twenty-two, twenty-three—and how those patterns continue.

Counting Over 100:

It's especially important to practice counting beyond 100. Many kids might jump from 100 straight to 200 or get stuck at tricky spots like 109. By counting regularly up to 120 or more, your child can better recognize these patterns and improve their confidence.

Counting Backwards:

Even if a child can count forward, counting backward can be a challenge. Try timing tasks at home using a countdown. For example, "You have until I count down to 20 to finish putting away your toys." You can start at different numbers, like 41, 40, 39... Counting down helps reinforce number patterns in a new way.

Starting from Different Numbers:

Encourage your child to count starting from numbers other than one. Can they begin counting from 7 or 28? How about counting up from 154? It's also great to practice skip counting (like counting by 2s, 5s, or 10s). See if your child can skip count starting at a two-digit or three-digit number. Using money is a motivational way to practice - just give your child a pile of coins and ask them to count.

Counting with Fractions:

Counting isn't just for whole numbers! Counting with fractions, like ½, 2/2, 3/2, 4/2, 5/2 can help your child build a strong understanding of fractions early on. Many kids struggle with fractions because we often don't make the connection to regular counting patterns. Show them that they can count fractions just like they count whole numbers, which helps them feel more comfortable with this new concept.

By practicing these different counting skills, you're helping your child build a solid foundation in math that will support their learning for years to come!
