Millstone Archery Club

The Millgrove Archery Team had an incredible season, demonstrating skill, dedication, and sportsmanship at every level of competition. With 200 team members, it was the largest archery team in Canada! The elementary team and middle school team went undefeated in all 6 of the tournaments they competed at. The highlight was defending the Alberta Provincial Title, with the Elementary team winning gold and silver in Bullseye, and the Middle School team earning gold for the first time! Both teams also claimed 3D championships. The High School team also had a strong showing, finishing fourth in a highly competitive division.

We are proud to have two archers and their Coach representing Canada on the NASP All-Star Team in Namibia, South Africa, this summer.

We also say goodbye to our graduating archers in Grade 12 this year. Two of these members have been part of the team since Grade 4, which is when it began, and they will be the first archers to complete the full program.

Literacy

The Millgrove Annual Spell-a-Thon fundraiser is taking place during the week of April 22-25. A list has been created and sent home by your child's teacher. Please practice these words so your child can feel successful.

To help your child at home:

- 1. Give your child a practice quiz, saying each word aloud within an example sentence and having them write the word down.
- 2. Ask them to correct the test themselves, identifying the words they missed and saying the word aloud while looking at the correct spelling.
- 3. Ask them to close their eyes and visualize the misspelled word, then spell the word out loud.
- 4. Then ask them to write the word again and then check to see if they spelled it correctly. If it's still wrong, ask them to repeat steps 2 and 3 before moving on.
- 5.On the night before the test, give them another practice quiz.

Numeracy

Math Focus in Our Classrooms: Fact Fluency – What Does It Mean?

When we talk about fact fluency, we don't just mean memorizing math facts. Instead, we want students to be:

- Accurate Getting the right answer.
- Flexible Using what they know to make connections and solve problems in different ways.
- Efficient Finding quick strategies to reach the answer without unnecessary steps.

Many families include reading in their daily routine, but what about practicing math? Just a few minutes a day can make a big difference, and the best part is—math practice can be FUN!

Ways to Build Fact Fluency at Home

Fun Dice Games

- Ten Thousand (or Farkle) → A fantastic game for practicing addition and strategic thinking!
 Players roll six dice and try to score points based on number combinations. Keeping a running total helps build fluency with adding and mental math.
- Make Ten → Roll two dice and try to make a sum of 10. If you roll a 6 and a 3, you need to figure out how much more is needed to make 10!
- Multiplication War → Each player rolls two dice and multiplies the numbers. The highest product wins that round!
- Race to 100 → Roll a die and keep a running total until you reach 100. Add a challenge by rolling two dice and adding or multiplying the numbers!
- Even or Odd Challenge → Roll a die and call out if the number is even or odd. Add a twist by rolling two dice and predicting whether their sum will be even or odd.

Play Math Card Games

- Go Fish with a Twist → Try "Go Ten" instead! Instead of matching cards, players find two numbers that add up to 10.
- Cribbage → This classic game helps children practice addition, number combinations to 15, and strategic thinking.
- Solitaire for Math → Lay out four cards above and four below. Find combinations that make 10, then replace them with new cards. Can your child clear the whole deck?

Numeracy continued

Math While You Cook

- While preparing dinner, have your child grab a deck of cards. Pick a number (like 5), then draw a card and add it.
 - Example: If they pull an $8 \rightarrow 8 + 5 = 13$.
 - Reinforce fluency with fact families:
 - **8** + 5 = 13
 - 5 + 8 = 13
 - 13 8 = 5
 - **13 5 = 8**
- This game works for multiplication and division facts, too!

Math on the Go

- Number Hunt → While driving, look for numbers on license plates or signs and add or subtract them.
- Skip Counting Challenge → Take turns skip counting by 2s, 5s, or 10s. Try starting at different numbers (e.g., start at 7 and count by 2s: 7, 9, 11...).
- Math Would You Rather? → Ask fun math-related questions, like "Would you rather have 3
 packs of 4 stickers or 2 packs of 6?"

Quick Practice Makes a Big Difference

Encourage your child to practice for just 10 minutes a day—whether it's playing a game, using flashcards, or spotting math in everyday life. The goal is to make fact fluency a natural and enjoyable part of learning!

By practicing regularly and having fun with math, students will become confident, flexible thinkers who can tackle any problem with ease!
