Pet Parade

We kick off the day with a Pet Parade from **9:15-10:00 am** in the field south of the school. Please take care in following a few simple rules of participation.

- pets and adult pet owners can assemble in the south field along the west fence between 8:45-9:05 am
- students go to class as they normally would and join parents and pets after class attendance and O Canada
- if students do not have pets for this day, that's ok they will stay with their classroom teacher to watch the parade
- NO PETS are allowed in the school
- pets must be on a leash, harness, in a cage or in a bowl
- bring your own pooper scooper supplies, as the Millgrove carnival will be held in the same area afterwards
- all pets must return home after the pet parade at 10:00 am while students return to their classrooms to prepare for the carnival activities

Carnival

The carnival activities will take place between 10:30 am - 12:30 pm Students will earn points as they participate in carnival activities. Five tally marks will earn students a bag of popcorn, and ten tally marks will get them a freezie.

Lunch

Through our President's Choice Children's Charity nutrition grant, our Millgrove Foundation will organize a Subway lunch for all students. Lunch order forms have gone home to families through your classroom teacher. Students participating will receive a Subway sandwich so, please supplement with other snacks to get students through the day.

Please be sure to send your child with appropriate clothing, a hat, and most importantly, a water bottle. Please apply sunscreen/bug spray at home before school. We're hoping for a sunny day!

The year-end assembly will be in the gym at approximately 2:00 pm.

Literacy

To encourage student's reading and to prevent the summer slide, here are some fun summer tips to encourage reading, prevent the loss of reading growth, and even foster greater reading success:

- Visit the Spruce Grove Library-The Summer Reading Club runs from July 2-August 16. Registration opens on June 10 (online or in person). You can call 780-962-4423 to sign up!
- **Read Just Right Books**-They should be at a reading level where the child can understand most of the words and phrases while still encountering some new vocabulary.
- **Reading Daily for at least 20 minutes** This can significantly benefit children's reading skills and overall development. By dedicating this time to reading, kids can improve their vocabulary, comprehension, and fluency. This practice also fosters a love for reading!
- **Read for Different Purposes** This can make learning more engaging and effective. Kids can read to gain information, for enjoyment, or to perform tasks like following directions or understanding instructions. This helps them develop various reading skills and makes them more aware of the different ways reading is used in everyday life.
- **Play Word Games**-They offer a fun and engaging way for kids to learn and practice various language skills. Some popular options include I Spy, Hangman, Word Scramble, Word Search, and even board games like Scrabble and Bananagrams. These games can help improve vocabulary, spelling, and problem-solving skills.

As always, any questions or concerns, please let me know.


